


Who and what we do at NCH...

Northwest Children's Home implements practices based on Trauma Informed Care (TIC). TIC is an organizational structure and treatment that involves understanding, recognizing, and responding to the effects of all types of trauma. The children we serve have been severely traumatized. The TIC model views "bad" behavior as a coping mechanism – the best they have available at the time and seeks to heal with patience, teaching and understanding. The children we care for have been extremely abused and/or neglected by adults who should have cared for them. We provide a safe place for them to heal and learn skills to be successful.


Being Trauma Informed is...

Having the capability to be humble, self-aware and compassionate. To hold and practice the value of service, dignity and worth of all persons, and importance of human relationship. It is to have the intention of extending compassion and promote resilience in every single person you meet. Being trauma informed is recognizing that every person is doing the best they can regardless of their age, gender, trauma, identity or bias. It means that we know we don't get to be the judge of anyone but ourselves, and that we have to wake up every day with the intention of learning something new. We are this way for the betterment of others-never ourselves-because if we are this way for our benefit, then we do not yet fully understand what it means to BE trauma informed.


